

CHECK YOUR PROGRESS

“and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.”

1. **Observation** – Watch kids’ behavior for examples of learned lessons.
2. **Verbal Responses** – Ask kids what they’ve learned, then listen to their responses.
3. **Review Game** – Form teams. Ask review questions. Give points to each team for correct answers.
4. **Drawing** – Have kids sketch Bible stories, murals, or cartoon strips. Use poster board, paint, crayons, markers, or even sidewalk chalk to illustrate their personal application of a lesson.
5. **Video Projects** – Have kids create videos that integrate lesson objectives, such as acting out modern-day parables. Show videos to entire class.
6. **Dramatic Presentation** – Let kids incorporate things they’ve learned by preparing and presenting any kind of drama, such as a pantomime, musical or one-act play.
7. **Music** – Have kids create a song that represents things they’ve learned.
8. **Role Play** – After a unit, present scenarios that require the application of the lesson’s content. Then have kids work together to role play solutions to the problem.
9. **Sculpting** – Have kids use different media (clay, play dough, aluminum foil, pipe cleaners, paper tearing) to create sculptures that illustrate how they’ll apply a lesson’s objective to their lives.
10. **“Why?” Circle** – Have up to four kids sit in a circle. Have one child make a comment about something he or she believes is true about God. Have other members ask “Why?” until the child has nothing more to say. Continue around the circle with each child stating a truth about God.
