- 1. Read **Titus 3:4-7.** This passage is not usually associated with Christmas, but how does it perfectly explain why the incarnation was necessary for our salvation, especially in light of our inability to save ourselves?
- 2. Read **Romans 3:20-24.** Can you identify ways you once trusted your own efforts, morality, or obedience—and how this passage confronts that kind of confidence?
- 3. Read **Philippians 2:8-11.** Why is it so important for Christians not to forget the cross when they consider the manger?
- 4. Read **1 Corinthians 1:30-31.** What does it mean that Christ is our wisdom, righteousness, sanctification, and redemption, and how does that truth recalibrate our view of ourselves?
- 5. Read **Colossians 1:24-27.** How can you, especially during this Christmas season, follow Christ's pattern of sacrifice in order to extend the hope of Christ to others?
